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Communication

Could communication between our school, parents and carers be improved? Yes - $47\%/N_0$ - 41% If yes, how?

'Send notifications earlier as sometimes they are last minute': Most of our emails or text messages are reminders about information that has been given to parents earlier.

'Put year group on texts': This will be done where possible as a lot of the information is aimed at more than one year group.

'Parent information about 'Legacy': There will be a 'Legacy' information assembly next term for parents to attend.

'School makes good use of social media to ensure parents are updated /Less emails more paper copies': As you can see different people have different preferences so we try to send information in a varied way to keep everyone happy!

'I would like to know about the topics my child is learning in class': We send a Key Stage newsletter each term explaining the topics and structure of the curriculum in your child's year group. On our school website you will find each year group's 'Big Picture' which is their curriculum intention for the term. Take a look on See Saw where you will find ongoing information of the work that is being done in our classrooms.

'Class assemblies for parents': Our Legacy assemblies will be rolled out to parents in the spring and summer terms.

How could the Newsletter be improved?

'New format is much better!': Thank you

'Remove repetitive parts and reduce the text': Sometimes the repeated information is necessary because it continues to be an issue in school (PE kits/naming clothing etc) or we are legally obliged to include it for parent information (Free school meal information). New parents join us all of the time so this is also a reason why we keep certain information on each month.

'More photos': Sometimes photos do not appear very clear and it is hard to identify the children in the photograph so we rely on Seesaw to tick that box, however we will endeavour to add more into the newsletter.

'Better as a PDF/Seems rushed': Putting the newsletter together does take a long time and it is done over a period of time and we sometimes wait for competitions to pass so that we can share our celebrations with you.

'Dates are in the past': The newsletter gives information about the month that was and the month that is to come. 'More regular newsletters perhaps weekly': I think if we do a weekly newsletter then it will become rushed, it will become repetitive and it would not have as much news for you as a monthly one - let me know what you think!

Which things about our school are you particularly pleased with?

'Children are happy and content! Good inclusion – no child is left out. My child loves to attend school. My child is safe and making good academic progress. My child has settled really well. My child is making amazing progress in maths and English. Reading is encouraged and celebrated. My child is happy and content and has good relationships with teachers and teaching assistants and peers. Children are engaged in their learning. The incentive to read with merits has really encouraged my son to read'.

'A family feel with good standards. Staff are amazing! Friendliness and exemplary manner of staff. Mrs Byrne on the gate and the friendly meet and greet every morning. A lovely welcome with a friendly environment, well run and good staff. Approachable and positive involvement with children. Staff encourage children to take part in things. The 'Legacy' principles. Nurture Group. Good mental health support. Before and After School club. Great support through medical issues. School plays and events are very good. Rewards for 'Standing out for the Right Reasons'. Year 6 arrangement with 2 teachers. Appropriate teacher intervention, Love the positive approach and learning through encouragement as it creates confident children with a sense of pride'.

'School lunches. Emails and texts are friendly and quick. Good communication. Foundation Stage Unit and our introduction to it. Parent introduction to Phonics. Lots of after school clubs for my child to join. Outdoor Learning and time outside. Your 'Race for Life' is fantastic! Seesaw. Great sports opportunities and School trips. The extra curricular activities are opening up new opportunities for my child who is making great progress'. Thank you for the comments above.

Are there any areas that you think we could improve?

'Traffic problems. Pick up time is hectic; Parking/bridge is dangerous. One-way system' We agree that we have a problem with traffic outside of school and we are fighting this battle daily.

There are plans to build a bridge over the beck that will enter straight into the school grounds.

Pick up time should run smoothly using the 'One-Way' system. Pick up starts with Foundation Stage (3pm), then Y1/2 and then Y3/4/5 and 6 and parents and carers are asked to leave using the one-way system past Year 1 classroom. To avoid the feeling of 'chaos' please ensure that when you are waiting for siblings, children are not running around school grounds. Many thanks

'More after school activities for lower age groups': The autumn term always begins with more after school opportunities for our Key stage 2 children as we feel our younger pupils (some are only just getting used to full time), are ready for home time at the end of the day. Spring and summer terms will see more opportunities for our FS2 and Y1/2 pupils.

'Which communication is used for what?: As stated on the October/November newsletter:

'Often the messages we send are reminders for information that has been sent out much earlier and these consist of – Our Teacher 2 Parent Text service, which is used for short reminders and emergency messages; email is used for longer messages and attachments; letters are sent home if the information requires a confirmation signature or written response and 'Facebook' is used to widen the net of communication and promote activities in school. On top of these we obviously use a telephone call and of course our Website and Newsletters.

'Use of gardens at front of school': Please let us know if you have any time or know of someone who can help with this. Thank you.

'Teacher/parent communication': As you know we promote an 'Open door' policy and if you have any concerns please let the school admin know and an appointment will be made for you.

In addition, I am at the school gate at the start and at the end of every day and every class teacher is outside at the end of the school where you can catch them for a chat.

'Less SATs - pressure of quizzes': We share that wish but we are directed by the Government regarding SATs. We use the term 'Quiz' to reduce the pressure on our children and we try not to put too much emphasis on them and make it fun.

'Reward for under achievers': All children are rewarded in school for a variety of things that they may do, whether it be academic or social aspects of learning.

'Climate change education': The Earth's climate is part of our Geography and PSHE&C curriculum and we teach the importance of looking after our planet and all who live on it. We have 'Eco Warriors' (as named in our school newsletter), that have been chosen from each year group and it is their role to highlight the importance of climate change and other issues regarding our planet Earth.

'Expensive trips - payment plan': We are aware of financial constraints that can affect us all, this is why any requests for payments for trips, daily or residential are given well in advance with options of payment instalments over time.

'Scale back Christmas performances': Our Christmas performances give our children opportunities to 'shine' and discover talents that they did not know they had. It is also part of our curriculum in the teaching of Art, DT, Music, Speaking and Listening and performance. We hope you enjoy the end results of our hard work and good fun whilst making them!

Are there any changes you would like to see?

a) Immediately

'Walking on the drive with taxis coming in and out': We only have 2 taxis that come in to school. A lot of the time the cars that are entering the school grounds are parents that should not be driving into the school carpark. Could we please ask that you do not drive into the school carpark (unless you have permission), during drop off and pick up times to ensure our children's safety.

'Queueing for drop off/People do not follow one-way system': The school gates are open at 8.45 so there should be no need for queueing and we can only keep asking for you to keep to the 'One-Way' system please.

b) Long Term

Meet with new teachers before they move to new class.

Love this idea and we will put it into practise at the end of the year!
